HOUSTON MSA & HISPANIC DEMOGRAPHICS

According to the Texas Data Center the Hispanic population estimate for the Houston metropolitan area is 5,718,678. The estimated racial makeup of the Houston MSA is 41% Hispanic, 30% White, 18% other and 11% Black. The city has the third-largest Hispanic population in the United States. It is estimated that about 400,000 immigrants reside in the Houston area illegally This influx of immigrants is partially responsible for Houston having a population younger than the national average. Based on reliable estimates there are currently two million (2,000,000) Hispanic/Latinos in the Greater Houston Metropolitan Area.

HESI COMMITMENT TO EDUCATION OF HISPANICS

HESI is deeply involved in education. The Hispanic population has grown dramatically in Houston and unfortunately Hispanic students have the largest dropout or non-completion rate of all ethnic groups. HESI contributes by establishing student groups (Hispanic Student Society International or HSSI) in local High Schools, where we provide mentors, role models from the Hispanic community that have been successful in business or academia and foremost, scholarships so these students can go on to higher learning institutions. Additional HSSI provides Life Coaching to student, Student & Parent Counseling, Preparing them for success with scholarship application and financial aid.

Statistics show that our traditional public schools do not have the resources or funds to provide personal attention to minorities, in their cultural or language adaptation during the first and second generation of residence in the USA HESI believes that helping the Hispanic students integrate and succeed in finish high school and go to college, will augment the benefits for our community and decrease social problems in the future. when it to cultural and language adaption to our USA mainstream.
